VOLUNTEER RESPONSIBILITIES

As a member of the Whitehall/Rural Volunteer Fire Department, there are certain responsibilities. There is more to being a volunteer than being a good firefighter. Training/business meetings are the second Tuesday of every month, attendance is preferred. There is a required 30 hours of training for the State Retirement Plan per year. Additionally, there is training twice a month. There will be notifications sent out by text or email.
